2020 Community Drop in's

Due to Covid-19 community drop in sessions have been postponed. The team are looking at alternative ways of holding sessions in line with government guidance to ensure all that attend are safe.

Project / Flood Scheme update - Phase 1

The project team are pleased to announce that the construction of Phase 1 is almost complete, with final touches being completed in the next couple of weeks. 91 properties in and around Parkside Close are at reduced risk of flooding due to the works.

Additional landscaping activities (bulb and tree planting) are being completed in November in Close Park, Dumers Lane and Morris Street. It will be necessary to return in April to complete some of the weather sensitive landscaping activities.

Project / Flood Scheme update – Lower Hinds

At Lower Hinds, the plans which include a new community green space and wetland, will leave behind a more natural floodplain and provide new habitat for a range of wildlife from birds to invertebrates. Planning permission for proposals was approved in September 2020, with conditions to be discharged.

Project / Flood Scheme update - Phase 2

Progress has continued to be excellent at Warth Road. The sheet piles construction is complete and construction of the concrete retaining wall will start in December.

Construction of the sheet piled defence from Warth Bridge to the back of Keswick Drive is complete. The construction of the concrete wall opposite St. Peters school is expected to start in December.

Sheet pilling construction at Redvales Business Park and York Street has been progressing slowly because of the complex temporary works require to support the bank.









Bury Council Update

Recent development proposals

National and local planning policy is clear that new developments shouldn't be granted planning permission if they would be at risk of flooding – or if they would increase risk of flooding for existing properties. Applications for development in flood risk areas therefore have to demonstrate, through a flood risk assessment report, that they won't increase flood risk. The following planning applications may be of interest:

- Housing development at York Street (Ref. 65847)
- Flood defence scheme applications at Buckley Wells (65809) and Hardy's Gate Bridge (65746) have now been submitted
- Flood defence scheme applications at Lower Hinds (64790) and the York Street Chemical Works (65171) have been approved
