

# Construction of the Kendal Flood Risk Management Scheme Dockray Hall



The Environment Agency is delivering a proposed three phase Flood Risk Management Scheme to better protect residential and business properties from flooding in the Kent catchment and improve the local environment and community amenities. Kendal is the first phase to be delivered with construction starting in February 2021. Burneside, Staveley and Ings is the second phase to be delivered and upstream storage will be the third phase.

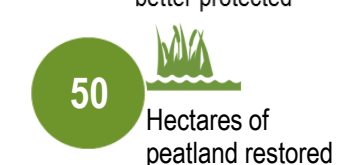
We will be delivering works in the Dockray Hall area starting early February, with the works anticipated to take 5 months to complete.

The works will be to the riverside wall that runs behind Dockray Hall Mill, and will consist of strengthening and repairing the existing wall. As we will be working on the footpath, the footpath will be temporarily closed during the construction works and a diversion will be in place as can be seen on the reverse of this letter.

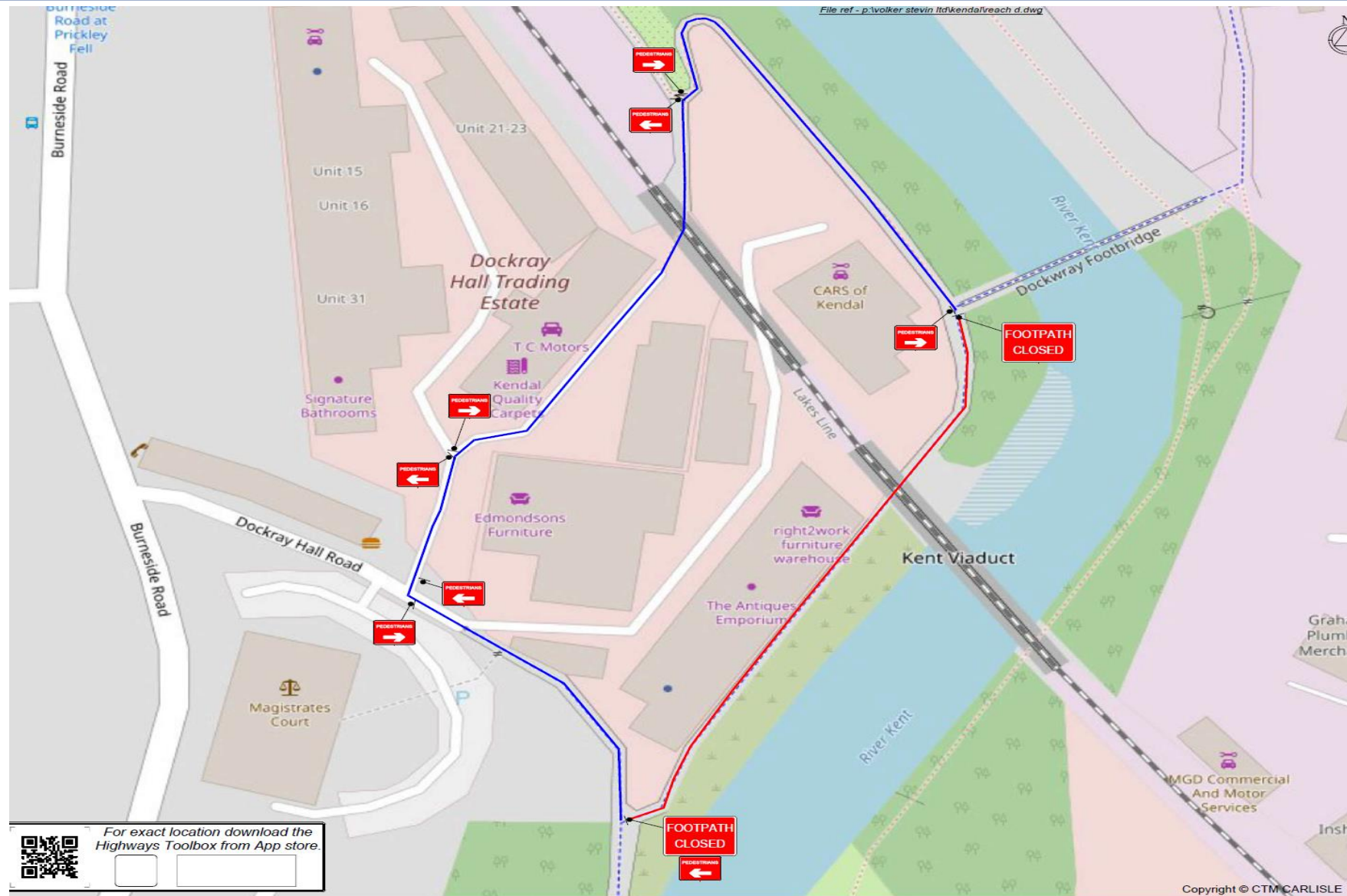
Our welfare cabins, plant and material will be located within the boundary of The Magistrates court, and you will see an increase in construction activity. Our team will do all they can to keep disruption to a minimum, and fence panels and netting will be used to minimise dust and debris.
