

Construction of the Kendal Flood Risk Management Scheme Romney Gardens



The Environment Agency is delivering a proposed three phase Flood Risk Management Scheme to better protect residential and business properties from flooding in the Kent catchment and improve the local environment and community amenities. Kendal is the first phase to be delivered with construction starting in February 2021. Burneside, Staveley and Ings is the second phase to be delivered and upstream storage will be the third phase.

We will be delivering works in the Romney Gardens area, starting week commencing 22nd February, with works anticipated to take 4 months to complete.

Site Preparation Work

Prior to the construction of the flood defence wall, some site preparation work will be undertaken. This will involve vegetation removal, a sewer diversion, and the temporary removal of riverside street lighting. The boundary fencing to some properties along the riverside footpath will be temporarily removed whilst we construct the wall, however this will then be replaced once complete on a like for like basis.

Construction work

The new flood defence wall will be 600mm in height, the position of which can be seen overleaf, and will be finished with imprinted brick concrete. As we will be working on the footpath, the footpath will be temporarily closed, and a diversion will be in place. During part of the works there may be some temporary parking restrictions, however access to properties will be maintained at all times.
