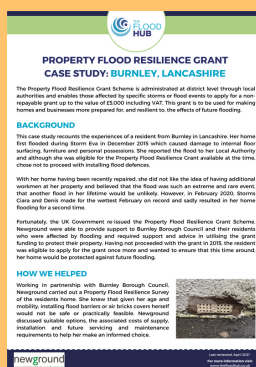

Case Study: Property Flood Resilience Grant, Burnley, Lancashire

With the help of a survey from the Newground flood team, a resident in Burnley whose property was affected by flooding utilised the Government's Property Flood Resilient Grant to install a package of flood defence works including flood doors, automatic air bricks and non-return valves.
