# Beezon Fields



Native trees will be planted in more rural locations on the edges of Kendal, e.g. Mintsfeet, Beezon Fields and Helsington Mills. These species will complement the natural setting of these spaces and provide an excellent resource for wildlife, providing food and shelter.



Both ornamental and native trees will be planted in town centre locations, including streets, parks and open spaces, e.g. Abbott Hall, Gooseholme Park and Aynam Road. Species will be selected that are appropriate in size and will provide seasonal interest.
