

West Kirby flood wall scheme: here's the plan

Workers from VolkerStevin, the council's specialist engineering partner on the West Kirby flood wall scheme, have this week begun work on site.

Initial works involve fencing off sections of the promenade and adjacent parking bays. This phase affects the stretch of promenade from Riversdale Road to Dee Lane to the north end, and the area known as the old Bath Site opposite Hilbre Court towards the other end of South Parade.

A footpath diversion will be in place for these works and these sections of promenade will be closed until the completion of the scheme in these areas.

At this time there is no need to close any part of South Parade to traffic - the road will remain fully open until piling activity begins. We will notify residents and the wider community about any road closures before they take place.

Travelling to West Kirby

By public transport

During the construction works we are encouraging visitors to travel to West Kirby by public transport. If you are not a local resident, you may find it useful to know West Kirby train station is conveniently located in the centre of West Kirby, with the beach just a five minute walk away.

There are also a number of bus services that start and terminate at West Kirby. [The Merseytravel website](#) provides the latest information on bus and train times and tickets.

By Car

Dee Lane car park is now fully closed to all motorists until November 2022. The nearest alternative large public car park is at West Kirby Concourse, accessed from Orrysdale Road. This car park is pay and display. The Morrisons car park in West Kirby is not affected by the closure of the Dee Lane car park.
