Who should participate?

The workshop will be of particular interest to local authority directors, housing officers, Lead Local Flood Authorities and climate change teams. It will also be relevant to policy makers in housing, flooding, insurance and climate change.

The Rochdale Flood Poverty Project was a 2 year study funded by North west Regional Flood and Coastal Committee and delivered by Rochdale Borough Council in partnership with National Flood Forum

The project facilitated a better understanding of the factors affecting the interrelationship between flood risk, housing and deprivation and their impact, including:

- An improved understanding of the barriers to appropriate flood insurance take up and sustaining affordable and effective property level resilience in deprived communities at significant risk of flooding.
- Establishing a robust and positive basis for cross sectoral partnership working around insurance take up and affordability, and sustainable property level flood resilience.
- Understanding the benefits of an in-depth and personalised approach to relationship building with disadvantaged communities at significant flood risk to win 'hearts and minds' and provide targeted support and activities that can break down barriers.
- Strengthening working with the social and private rented sectors to deliver flood literacy, improved communication and relationships with tenants and better investment in sustainable flood resilience.
- Testing new approaches to embedding flood resilience through integrated, cross sectoral delivery.
