Significant risk to life and property.

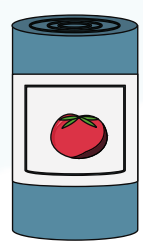
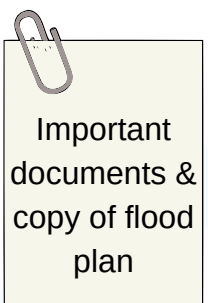
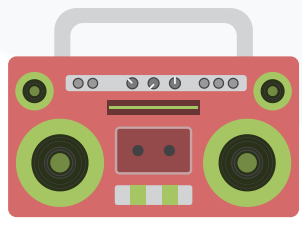
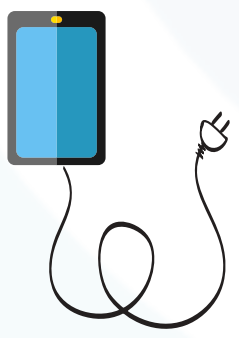
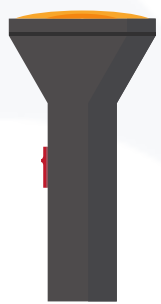
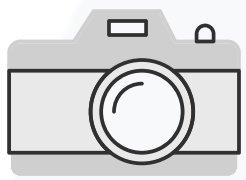
